O Zion, that bringest good tidings, get thee up to the heights and sing! Proclaim to a desolate people the coming of their King.

Like the flowers of the field they perish, like grass our works decay; the power and pomp of nations shall pass, like a dream, away.

But the word of our God endureth, Whose arm is ever strong; God stands in the midst of nations, and soon will right the wrong. God shall feed the flock like a shepherd, the lambs so gently hold; to pastures of peace will lead them, and bring the safe to fold.

REFLECTION

This story brings men into the fold, albeit with mixed response to the promise. For Zachariah, this story was hard to believe. Unfortunately, he lost his voice. It becomes the precursor of what was to follow, where Jesus' story and message was accepted by the "non-cultic folks" or religious outsiders. The renowned religious leader did every ritual, going into the holy of holies, yet he did not believe the message from the angel. He would swing the thurible, yet didn't believe when it comes to the crucibles of faith. Believing the annunciation or proclamation.

On the other hand, women believed what the Angels said. This story is replete with metaphysical beings though. This brought me to a question; "do we really need to understand everything God is doing in our lives?" Does our faith depend on human intellectual prowess or a matter of trust/faith? The intellectual in me is asking; "is faith enough without understanding?" What do you think? What is the difference between a story and an historical event?

Unconventional Tradition

John did not get named after a family member, not believed by the priest, eventually never inherited his Father's office. He even later left the city altogether to live and preach from the Transjordan valley. No sacrifices, no portions of the sacrificed animals. No remuneration of any kind. He did not dress like any of them. He would not be bribed into accepting immoral behavior of the king. He called Herod on inheriting his young brother's wife. Very unconventional. What a disruptive son to the conventional order of the family and religious tradition. What a change? The name John in Hebrew, means – "God is gracious." Thus, it is not a masculine name as the society has assigned and limited it. Elizabeth named him, and Zechariah confirmed it by writing. The society was shocked to see that. That is change. In simplest terms; Change is disruptive in its essence. God's grace prophesied by John's name was coming through Jesus. It was a paradigm shift from religious legalism. Are we choosing to change and follow the good news of grace? Are we choosing to stay the same? The choice is yours.

Luke's story is not premised on too much tradition. If we are not careful, we can cause a lot of harm in pursuit of our appetite for cultural and traditional practices, which have nothing to do

with the gospel message. In fact, I would argue that: most of the hostilities in the church and other religions, have nothing to do with the good our faiths teach. Rather, it's because we want the communities to fulfil our socially constructed valued & traditions.

The Christmas Story Ushers in a change: John as a name, point to grace, not punishment. Zechariah prophesied about going before the Lord, to prepare the way. That laid the foundations for the gospel message. We are reminded of the ideals of Jesus, which are hardly traditional or conventional. Sometimes, we need to take a stand about ourselves, and not get pushed around by mythical traditions. We need to start interrogating some of these established practices before following them. Remember the practice of "cutting the ham?" Do we have a reason to do what we are doing, or ask people to do? Healthy faith is always in conversation with lived experience, seeking meaning and understanding. The moment we stop asking questions is the moment our faith becomes dead. That is why traditionalism "is the dead faith of the living," as opposed to tradition "which is the living faith of the dead."
