³⁶ In Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha (in Greek her name is Dorcas); she was always doing good and helping the poor. ³⁷ About that time she became sick and died, and her body was washed and placed in an upstairs room. ³⁸ Lydda was near Joppa; so when the disciples heard that Peter was in Lydda, they sent two men to him and urged him, "Please come at once!" ³⁹ Peter went with them, and when he arrived, he was taken upstairs to the room. All the widows stood around him, crying and showing him the robes and other clothing, that Dorcas had made while she was still with them. ⁴⁰ Peter sent them all out of the room; then he got down on his knees and prayed. Turning toward the dead woman, he said, "Tabitha, get up." She opened her eyes, and seeing Peter she sat up. ⁴¹ He took her by the hand and helped her to her feet. Then he called for the believers, especially the widows, and presented her to them alive. ⁴² This became known all over Joppa, and many people believed in the Lord. ⁴³ Peter stayed in Joppa for some time with a tanner named Simon.

REFLECTION

"Witnessing Outside the Building Happens Through Acts of Kindness."

The story of Dorcas is a popular one, in the history of the Early Church. The significant thing about her giving was that of her recipients. The societal norm would be giving to someone who has the capacity to give you something in return. Not for her. Tabitha gave to people who had no means of reciprocating the love. What also makes her charity stands out is the value of her giving. Sometimes doing the right thing becomes more significant or even crucial, if the conditions are critical. For people who had no other source of provision, her kindness & generosity was their hope. We need to consider doing the right things when it's the right time.

The Early Church grew so fast in the days of the apostles, & we may need to look at what was the reason. They had two things central to their growth. First, everyone was a witness to their story of Jesus. Everyone had an obligation to witness, on a daily basis, and in every place of their daily life. The followers of Jesus shared their new found hope, knowledge & understanding of God, as revealed in Jesus. They engaged in who Jesus was, is & shall become. The shared the word of God, like no other philosophy. They shared their faith in the streets, in the courtyards, farms, business communities, and even in shipyards, as they either travel with vessels or as they send parcels. Everything in their lives was associated with the Easter Story and message.

Second, they were radically generous and sought justice for everyone. The early church was aggressively kind, and sought justice with unusual sense of urgency. Remember Acts 6:2, Peter said, "It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the Word in order to wait on tables." Otherwise, the community was demanding that everything was to be suspended until the widows get their share. This was a key component of the church's ministry & witnessing. No bible verses were recited but they lived them out. Let us know how to live out the scriptures more than citing bible verses that are never substantiated but our action.

In our UCC they say; "think globally but act locally." But would I say, we need both. We probably need to be; "angels at home & abroad." Kindness is like light; it begins where it is lit, and it shines all the way.

In the history of the Church or in the Scriptures, Tabitha was never pointed out for being the most educated, richest, or most experienced. It is not how much we know, but how much we care. Tabither/Dorcas was never mentioned as a preacher, but a practical believer. She lived out compassion, kindness & generosity. She was remembered by the beneficiaries of her life-style, not friends or relatives. Eulogy is great but it is often given by friends & relatives. This was a display of radical love in empirical evidence or tangible evidence. Her witness was in action. Let us seek to make an impact by serving our communities.

More Action, Less Words

When she died, Peter was called to deal with that kind of loss. They needed her back. Most of us may not be in that category. When we die, I hope no one will say, "they better be gone." In some cases, people may even wish their colleagues negative stuff. In the economic sense, she was an asset, not

a liability to either the church or the community. This lady stirred an uproar among the strangers, the marginalized and the vulnerable. The leadership had to do something. Tabitha demonstrated one of the ways to make people believe in you. It is to act. Words may be misinterpreted but rarely do people misinterpret action. What our world needs now is not a lot of empty Bible quotes, but living out the verses. Let us pray that God may raise among us, people of aggressive compassion, radical love and non-negotiable principles of justice.

God Can Do More with & Through Us. The other element adopted by the early church charismatic gifts employed in private spaces. The charismatic members sought to make a difference in the lives of others, rather than creating a spectacle. The mega churches today invite the crowds to come & see the show & display of the extra ordinary gifts of the "prophets." Peter had learned from Jesus, went inside for Ernest prayers.

God can do more through us. God's hand is being witnessed in our work. Do we believe God can use us, to change somebody's world? Tabitha changed people's lives, the disciples demanded equal share of the money. God is at work through us. We need the zeal, urgency and rational. Peter was invited and left immediately. Let us treat this message of God's love with urgency.

Pope Francis in his Last words; reminds us that we should "care for one another, increase our mutual solidarity & work for the integral development of each human person." He finishes by describing "helping the needy, fighting hunger, & promoting development" as "weapons of peace; weapons that build the future." In his time, he visited & apologized to the Indigenous peoples of Canada. We are called to do more than just words or witness, but action that might even cause pain.

Assessing Our Impact in the Community.

Everyone's work is measured by the impact you make, more than the intention. The modern day advocates for justice will argue that; "It's not enough to have a good intention." You need to check the impact, if one is injured during the event." Tabitha had a significant impact. Farther Jerry Orbos once said; "Do not prepare the road for your children. Prepare your children for the road." They should not only go far and fast, but learn to slow down, helping the need, be compassionate and attend to emotional needs of the people along their life journey.

May we open our lives to God, to be transformed, so that we can transform our communities, serving as disciples. May God be present in our generosity, in our food drives, donations, & any other works of kindness should be blessed.
